The Intervention Support Plan programme is a whole school intervention strategy with the aim of supporting your child to make at least expected progress in all of their subjects. The ISP will highlight where your child is underperforming, identify their barriers to learning and provide strategies which will support them in response to this.

Below is an overview of the ISP process:

Student identified in school who would benefit from ISP at SLT level



Data collected from a number of sources to create a student profile



Meeting with student to discuss the data and identify what they think they need to do to reach expected progress in particular subjects



Student action plan produced with Progress Manager and student



Letter sent home with Student profile and action plan



Parent meeting in school with student, Progress Manager and SLT member



Review meeting 1 to discuss progress on ISP



Review meeting 2 to discuss progress on ISP



Review meeting 3 to discuss progress on ISP

^{**} If your child is not engaging positively with the programme, you may be invited to attend a progress meeting outside of the review meeting, to address the schools' concerns**

Why is your child on ISP?

Your child has been chosen to go on an ISP to help improve their progress and ultimately reach their full academic potential. I am sure you will agree, it is vital that child performs to the best of their ability: achieving the grades which will inevitably prepare them for later life. Where students are at risk of not achieving this, it is our duty to provide a network of support which will refocus, reguide and realign them on the correct path. Time and time again, research indicates good education generates lifelong benefits; students are more likely to succeed and develop in their chosen career because they have the knowledge and skills required for the job.
