They have recognised the importance each charity does to support people and why it is important to raise the profile for charities!






What we've been learning this half-term...

Year 7 Music – Half Term Overview

This half term, Year 7 students have been introduced to some of the key building blocks of music, including pulse, rhythm, and basic musical notation. Through a range of listening exercises and practical activities, they have started to develop their understanding of how music is structured and how it can be created and performed. Students have had the opportunity to get hands-on with a variety of percussion instruments, working in small groups to rehearse and perform short rhythmic pieces. They've also taken their creativity a step further by composing their own music, applying what they've learned about rhythm and notation.

It's been a fun and engaging start to their music journey here at the King's, and they've made great progress in developing both their musical skills and their confidence when performing as part of a group.









Over the last half term our KS4 students have been really busy with writing CV's, applying for college places and researching and contacting employers for work experience placements. The effort students are putting in to work towards their post 16 provisions is amazing - Keep up the hard work.


Students engaged in thoughtful discussions, sharing their ideas, feelings, and attitudes about food poverty and community support.
